

# **Performance Development Tips**

## General performance development tips:

- 1. Performance should be under the time limit
- 2. Do not use too much technology. Technology can mess up and ruin an entire performance. You cannot have a  $2^{nd}$  chance to perfect the technology.
- 3. If music is used:
  - a. Make sure it is played at the proper time.
  - b. Make sure it fits your project topic well
  - c. Make sure you do not use too much music throughout the performance.
- 4. Make eye contact throughout the performance with judges and audience members.
- 5. Every time you practice you will get BETTER!
- 6. Work triangles.
- 7. Speak slowly and clearly. You must enunciate!
- 8. Face towards audience always! Your volume will be lost and not heard if you turn away.

## **Script writing:**

- 1. Start with 3 to 5 character ideas.
- 2. Start with 6 to 8 scene ideas and determine which ones will best help your performance share the unsung heroes story.
- 3. Gather quotes, primary sources, and interviews to support the 6 to 8 scene ideas. Choose the best ideas to put into the performance.
- 4. If you start writing the performance and choose to go a different direction than originally planned that is not an issue.
- 5. Have between 3 to 6 different scenes portrayed in your performance.
- 6. Develop a first draft and continue to re-write and change throughout all stages to best share the unsung heroes' story.
- 7. Make sure your script clearly explains the actions of the unsung hero.
- 8. Make sure transitions are smooth between scenes and the performance flows.

### Intro/Ending:

- 1. All members must introduce themselves at the beginning of the performance.
- 2. End the performance with a bow. Everyone must smoothly bow together.
- 3. Come up from bow smiling at the audience.

#### **Props:**

- 1. Do not overdue props.
- 2. Do not overdue backdrop.
- 3. Performance must be ready to compete before developing more elaborate props.
- 4. Primary props or replicas are always a plus.

#### **Costumes:**

- 1. Do not overdue costumes, but make them as close to the time period as possible.
- 2. Primary costumes or replicas are always a plus.
- 3. Suggestion: Narrator wear black bottoms and white top for a neutral professional look.
